







### International Student Population at CWRU, Fall 2009-Fall




### Percentage of International Students in Each School's Population, Graduate/Professional



### Case Western Reserve University International Students by Country, Fall 2014




#### Number of International Students, by State






#### **Estimated Expenditures of International Students, by State**

# **Keeping International Students in the Midwest/Attracting other Immigrants**

#### **EDS AND MEDS**

Northeast Ohio's economic shift from manufacturing to a knowledge-based economy creates more demand for high-skilled workers with college degrees.

Many immigrants with advanced degrees are in engineering, life sciences, physical sciences, and computer sciences.

Cleveland's fastest growing industries are education, medicine and technology, ranking 11<sup>th</sup> in the nation in these areas.

Such growth in these statistics appeals to high-skilled immigrants, and makes Northeast Ohio a high-skilled immigrant destination.


Internationalization of high skilled employment is consistently climbing at a fast rate in the "Rust Belt" cities. Highly skilled immigrants are aiding in the economic rebuilding of the Rust Belt cities.

#### **Education**

Greater Cleveland ranks 23<sup>rd</sup> in the nation in education and knowledge creation, which includes employment in colleges, universities and research institutions.

Cleveland's peer city, Pittsburgh ranks 9<sup>th</sup>, as the city has become an exporter of education through internationalization efforts. This brings \$431.2 million more than Cleveland into the local economy through higher education.

#### Medicine

Cuyahoga County ranks 6<sup>th</sup> in hospital and healthcare related jobs in the nation at 75,767 jobs.

Cuyahoga County also has the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest job growth rate (58%) out of the top healthcare related employment cities.

Cleveland has led the Rust Belt cities in the number of H1B visas certified for healthcare-related jobs in 5 years (from 251 H1B's in 2010 to 338 H1B's in 2014).

## "BRAIN DRAIN" vs. "BRAIN GAIN" IN NORTHEAST OHIO

In Cleveland, the number of 25- to 34-year-old college graduates grew by 9000 from 2011 to 2012 alone; approximately 7500 of those were born outside of Ohio.

From 2000 to 2012, the Cleveland MSA lost nearly 78,000 residents without a college degree, yet added over 63,000 new college-educated residents.

The Northeast Ohio region ranks 5<sup>th</sup> in the nation in the percentage of immigrants with advanced degrees (21.2%); the region ranks 35<sup>th</sup> in the nation for native-born citizens with advanced degrees (10.7%).
