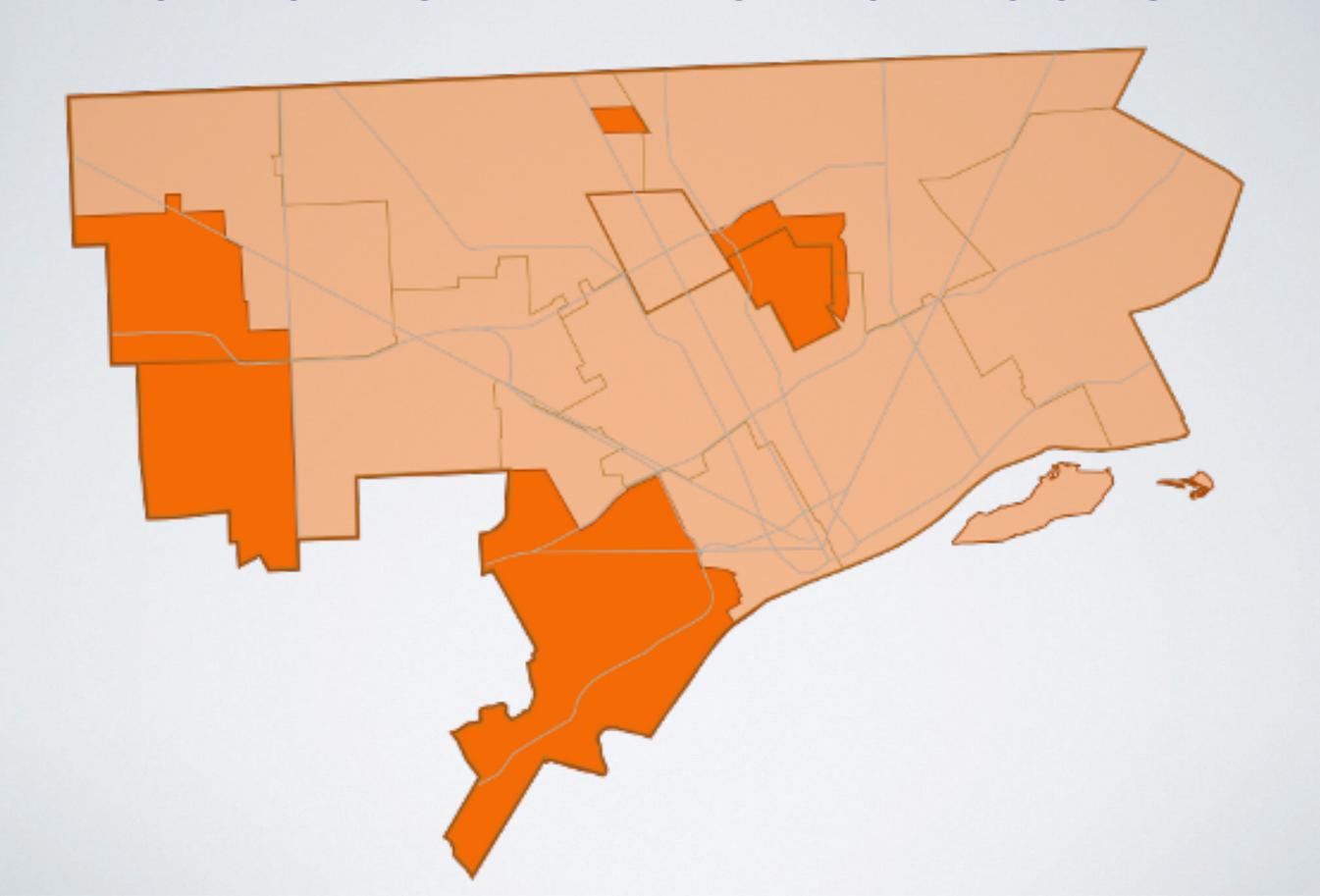


Global Detroit Goals

WHY APPLY NOW?

- Help is here. Free preparation assistance for the application, ESL, and the exam is available, regardless of income.
- So you can vote in the next election
- Protection from deportation for yourself (and your children)
- To petition for more family members to join you in the United States before immigration reform limits categories of kinship
- You may qualify for a fee waiver!

You will need to bring the following

CULTURAL AMBASSADORS: CONNECTING RESIDENTS TO IMMIGRANTS



Become a Citizenship Ambassador

with Global Detroit's Cultural Ambassadors Program

And help candidates navigate the path to becoming citizens.

Global Detroit and the New Americans Campaign supports increased citizenship for immigrants as an economic development strategy, and we need your help.

More than eight million people live, work, and pay taxes in the U.S. and are eligible for citizenship, yet only about eight percent of them naturalize each year. Through citizenship they contribute more fully to the vitality of our communities and our democracy as a whole. The Cultural Ambassadors Program wants to help remove the barriers these people face and help them gain the rights, freedoms and responsibilities of citizenship.

Benefits of Naturalization

Naturalized citizens:

- earnings are well above those of non-citizen immigrants a rise of 8-11% after naturalization
- · family incomes are 15% higher than noncitizens
- stay in the U.S. longer
- have better English language abilities
- have more education
- have lower unemployment rates
- · are half as likely to live below the poverty line
- weathered the recent economic crisis more successfully than noncitizens

There are 4 ways you can participate:

- Promote Citizenship in the community: help spread the word about the benefits of citizenship and the resources available to help.
- Volunteer at workshops or other events: sign up to assist with registration, logistics, intake, or interpretation.
- Assist candidates in completing applications: complete our training and sign up to help candidates complete their applications at workshops or DNAC offices.
- Test preparation: assist candidates with studying, English skills, and mock interviews.

If the Lawful Permanent Residents (LPRs) in the U.S. became citizens, it would bolster the economy, with ripple effects for generations forward – naturalized citizens put money back into the economy, provide strength to communities, and make our regional economy more productive.

Detroit New Americans Campaign (DNAC) is a collaborative project of



five immigrant-based organizations whose purposes are to mobilize and leverage local and national resources, civic and community partners,

immigrant communities, and volunteers in an effort to promote and assist naturalization for eligible Legal Permanent Residents (LPRs) throughout the metropolitan Detroit area. The project encourages naturalization and its benefits through media-based advocacy, informational sessions, and one-on-one meetings with immigration attomeys in individual appointments, clinics, and group workshops.

DNAC is the largest regional collaborative project and with its programs is acknowledged as the "Ga teway" to Natura lization in Southeast Michigan. Last year alone DNAC partners assisted over 1,000 LPRs with Naturalization Applications.

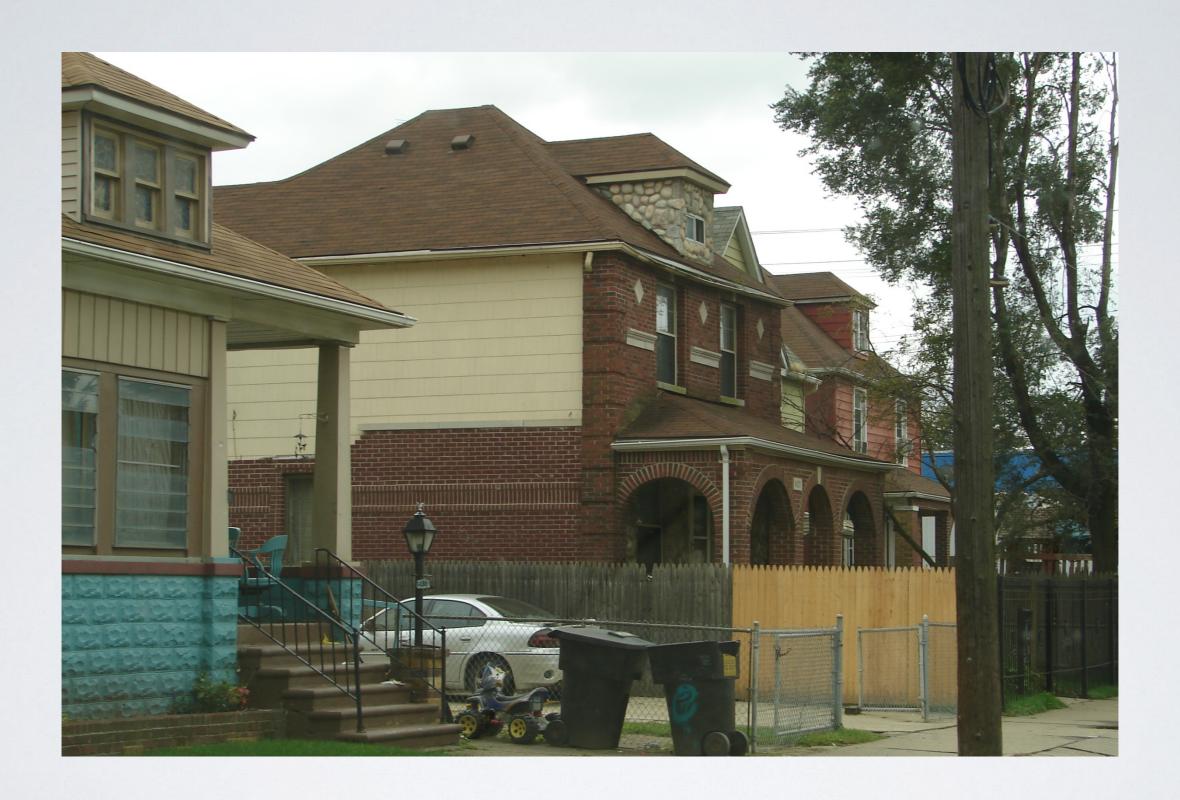
- Connecting immigrants to resources such as NEIdeas grants, Motor City Match building rehab grants, Detroit Land Bank Authority and County auctions in Spanish
