



### Rust Belt Is Hemorrhaging Jobs & People


### MICHIGAN

- Over last 10 years, lost
- 790,000 jobs
- Detroit: over last 60 years, lost 50% of population (1.8 million to 900,000)
- Percentage of immigrants dropped from 30% to 10%

OHIO

- Over last 10 years, lost 525,000 jobs
- Cleveland: over last 60 years, lost 60% of population (950,000 to 396,000) (17% in 10 yrs)
- Percentage of immigrants dropped from 30% to 5%



Immigrants largely compliment, not displace, Americanborn workforce.



Immigrant workers usually work in highskilled or lower skilled jobs, where U.S. has a shortage of workers.












































## Ohio Immigrant Entrepreneurs & Consumers: The Facts

- 13,740 Asian owned businesses had sales of \$5.1 billion, and employed 42,955 people
- 7,109 Latino owned businesses had sales of \$1.3 billion and employed 11,348 people
- 2009 purchasing power of Ohio's Latino's totaled \$6.6 billion (increasing 334% since 1990)
- Asian buying power totaled \$6.9 billion (increase of 270% since 1990)

















**Proportions** of Discussions on Illegal Immigration Mentioning **Crime** in 2007




## Immigration and Crime FACTS
